Channel View School for Research is a safe, disciplined learning environment that fosters a community spirit and expects all students to achieve academic excellence.

We have adopted a school dress code policy that will achieve the following results:

Dress Code Promote School Unity: Parents, teachers, administrators, and students report that dress codes increase school spirit. In addition, school dress codes help form a positive cohesive image with both students and the community.

Dress Codes Support Good Discipline: Appropriate clothing generates fewer distractions and established a more orderly classroom.

Dress Codes Supports Neatness: A designated student wardrobe is a positive way to establish neatness as a habit. We expect these habits to carry over to students school work.

Dress Codes Cost Savings: The average annual cost of school clothes is considerably less for students enrolled in schools with a dress code program.

Dress Code Relieve Peer Pressure: Television, Magazines, newspapers, and peers no longer dictate the clothing that parents purchase for their children. The struggle to keep up with a friend or fellow classmate who has all of the “right” labels is eliminated. Dress codes allow students to be recognized for who they are rather than what they wear.
